

# Healing School Class 50

“For they are life to those who find them, And health to all their flesh.”  
Proverbs 4:22 NKJV

“He sent His word and healed them And delivered them from their  
destructions.”  
Psalms 107:20 NKJV

“But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our  
iniquities; The chastisement for our peace was upon Him, And by His stripes  
we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; We have turned, everyone,  
to his own way; And the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.” Isaiah  
53:5-6 NKJV

Our confession of the Word of God calls for healing which is already ours but  
is not in manifestation in our bodies.

“Then they cried out to the Lord in their trouble, And He saved them out of  
their distresses. He sent His word and healed them And delivered them from  
their destructions.” Psalms 107:19-20 NKJV

“(As it is written, “I have made you a father of many nations”) in the presence  
of Him whom he believed God, who gives life to the dead and calls those things  
which do not exist as though they did;”. Romans 4:17 NKJV

“No longer shall your name be called Abram, but your name shall be Abraham;  
for I have made you a father of many nations.” Genesis 17:5 NKJV

This was God’s method of helping him change his image, and it caused him to  
be fully persuaded.

“But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise,  
and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things  
which are mighty; and the base things of the world and the things which are  
despised God has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the  
things that are,”

I Corinthians 1:27-28 NKJV

God uses spiritual forces which are not seen to nullify natural things that are seen.

“And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, “I believed and therefore I spoke,” we also believe and therefore speak,” II Corinthians 4:13 NKJV

“I believed; therefore, I spoke, “I am greatly afflicted.”” Psalms 116:10 NKJV

“I shall not die, but live, And declare the works of the Lord.” Psalms 118:17 NKJV

We should declare to ourselves what God’s word reveals about us, regardless of the circumstances or how we feel about it.

“But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, “Do not say in your heart, “Who will ascend into heaven?” ” (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or, “Who will descend into the abyss?” ” (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith which we preach):” Romans 10:6-8 NKJV

You don’t deny that sickness exists, but you deny its right to exist in your body.

“Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree”),” Galatians 3:13 NKJV

“He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love,” Colossians 1:13 NKJV

“as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.” II Peter 1:3-4 NKJV

You are not trying to convince anyone that you are not sick, but you are simply proclaiming what God has said in His Word to be truth, regardless of your present condition.

“Who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed.”  
I Peter 2:24 NKJV

Your words have more effect on your body than anyone else's words.

“For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, ‘Be removed and be cast into the sea,’ and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says.” Mark 11:23 NKJV
