

## Healing School Class 64

“And these signs will follow those who believe: In My name they will cast out demons; they will speak with new tongues; they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover.”” Mark 16:17-18 NKJV

“For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.” 1 Corinthians 11:29 KJV

“For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.” I Corinthians 11:29 NKJV

Discerning means “making a distinction between”. What distinction is here referred to? Because you do not discern between the significance of the bread and the wine when partaking of communion many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep (are prematurely dead).

“For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.”  
1 Corinthians 11:30 KJV

“And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it. And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.”  
Exodus 12:7-8 KJV

God commanded them to cook the flesh of the first Passover Lamb and eat it for their own physical benefits.

“Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:”. 1 Corinthians 5:7 KJV

“Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.”

1 Peter 2:24 KJV

By the bruise of whom ye were healed physically this is the literal translation of 1 Peter 2:24.

Healed is *iaomai* in Greek and “is referring to physical healing” in every scripture in New Testament.

“What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought (redeemed) with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.”

1 Corinthians 6:19-20 KJV

Our bodies and our spirits have been redeemed with the very same price. The blood of Christ.

“For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.” 1 Corinthians 11:29 KJV

“There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.” Romans 8:1 KJV

Condemnation means sentence standing against.

“And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace.”  
Luke 7:50 KJV

The word here for “hath saved” is *sesoken*, the perfect, third singular of *sozo*, I save.

“And he said unto her, Daughter, be of good comfort: thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace.” Luke 8:48 KJV

Ha the made thee whole is the same word *sesoken* I save. This is positive proof that the very same faith that saves the spirit also will heal the body.

“But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.”

Hebrews 11:6 KJV

If God demands that we have faith when it is impossible for us to have faith, then we have a right to challenge His justice.

“So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.”

Romans 10:17 KJV
