Wherefore I say unto you, All manner of sin and blasphemy shall be forgiven unto men: but the blasphemy against the Holy Ghost shall not be forgiven unto men. **(Matthew 12:31 KJV)** 

The unpardonable sin is simply to consistently reject Jesus!

But when the Comforter is come, whom I will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of truth, which proceedeth from the Father, he shall testify of me: **(John 15:26 KJV)** 

Who was Jesus talking to when He spoke of the unpardonable sin? He was speaking to the Pharisees, who continually rejected Him as their Savior and plotted to kill Him on several occasions.

And the scribes which came down from Jerusalem said, He hath Beelzebub, and by the prince of the devils casteth he out devils. **(Mark 3:22 KJV)** 

Verily I say unto you, All sins shall be forgiven unto the sons of men, and blasphemies wherewith soever they shall blaspheme: but he that shall blaspheme against the Holy Ghost hath never forgiveness, but is in danger of eternal damnation: because they said, He hath an unclean spirit. **(Mark 3:28-30 KJV)** 

It is impossible for a believer to commit the unpardonable sin.

Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. **(2 Timothy 2:15 KJV)** 

What Jesus said before the cross and what He said after the cross were spoken under completely different covenants.

And if thy right eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy members should perish, and not that thy whole body should be cast into hell. **(Matthew 5:29 KJV)** 

O generation of vipers, how can ye, being evil, speak good things? for out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh. **(Matthew 12:34 KJV)** 

Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell? (Matthew 23:33 KJV)

Jesus never called sinners or prostitutes or corrupt tax collectors "a brood of vipers". He saved those harsh words for the Pharisees. Not everything that Jesus said was spoken for the church.

Paul never mentioned the unpardonable sin. If Christians could commit the unpardonable sin, he should have mentioned it in every epistle that he wrote.

And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together with him, having forgiven you all trespasses; **(Colossians 2:13 KJV)** 

Jesus has cleansed you of the sins of your entire life and you are now sealed with the promise of eternal life. Knowing that all your sins are forgiven is crucial for your health, peace of mind, wholeness, and wellness.

For by a single offering He has forever completely cleansed and perfected those who are consecrated and made holy. **(Hebrews 10:14 AMPC)** 

For finding fault with them, he saith, Behold, the days come, saith the Lord, When I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah: Not according to the covenant that I made with their fathers In the day when I took them by the hand to lead them out of the land of Egypt; Because they continued not in my covenant, And I regarded them not, saith the Lord. For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel After those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, And write them in their hearts: And I will be to them a God, And they shall be to me a people: And they shall not teach every man his neighbour, And every man his brother, saying, Know the Lord: For all shall know me, From the least to the greatest. For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, And their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more. **(Hebrews 8:8-12 KJV)** 

And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; for this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. (Matthew 26:26-28 KJV)

All your records of your sins have been destroyed by the blood of Jesus when He cried out, "It is finished".

When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost. **(John 19:30 KJV)**
